Childwall Sports & Science Academy **16-19 Tuition Fund Statement**

The Education and Skills Funding Agency 16 to 19 tuition fund has been allocated to schools and colleges in 2021/22 in addition to the main tuition funding they will receive. This funding is being provided to support small group tuition for 16 to 19 students in English and Maths where learning has been disrupted because of the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.

The tuition fund will be utilised to support individual or small groups of young people aged 16-19 who have yet to achieve a standard pass, grade 4 in English and/ or Mathematics. Students at KS5, within this age bracket that are eligible for Bursary and those with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities, (SEND) will also be supported by this provision.

Childwall Sports and Science Academy will direct this funding where it will have the most impact, using student starting points and with clear evidence of the assessment of need, we are committed to:

- Ensuring that students who have not yet achieved a GCSE in English/ Maths at grade 4 have access to English and Maths tuition, above and beyond their study programme entitlement.
- Prioritising students for additional tuition to ensure that those who need extra support receive it first.

Childwall Sports and Science Academy has bespoke intervention and revision sessions available in addition to the planned programme of study hours already timetabled for the academic year 2021/22. These are led by need and reviewed frequently to ensure students are fully prepared for their learning and next steps. Tutoring sessions funded by this government initiative will be in addition to the current offer and will be delivered by an external agency with the relevant skills and experience. Tutor groupings will consist of no more than three students.

Sessions will be facilitated face to face or using our remote platform of MS Teams. All tutors will adhere to the Sixth Form quality assurance programme and safeguarding protocols.
